








PCOA PERFORMANCE: 4-YEAR TREND

(2017 - 2020)








NAPLEX PERFORMANCE: 4-YEAR TREND

(First-time Pass Rates (%) for 2017—2020 Graduates)








MPJE PERFORMANCE: 4-YEAR TREND

(First-time Pass Rates (%) for 2017—2020 Graduates)






