

The Pharm.D. program prepares students to effectively manage a patient-centered pharmacy practice








Graduating Students








Graduating Students

I would choose to study pharmacy








Graduating Students

I would recommend a career in pharmacy to a friend or relative



If I were to start my education today, I would choose the same college/school of pharmacy




